COMMISSION MEETING AGENDA

- 1. <u>Title 39 DWI</u> Consideration of a Memorandum summarizing recent studies regarding DWI and IID effectiveness and containing draft statutory language based on a bill introduced by Senator Scutari in March.
- 2. <u>Strict Liability; Environmental Claims</u> Consideration of a Memorandum to clarify ambiguity in the interpretation and application of the limitations period and extension provision in the New Jersey Brownfield and Contaminated Site Remediation Act, *N.J.S.* 58:10B-17.1. *New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection v. Exxon Mobil Corp.*, 420 N. J. Super. 395 (2011)
- 3. <u>Title 2C Sexual Offenses</u> Consideration of a Memorandum outlining an approach to the first part of a project to revise Chapter 14 of the criminal code which pertains to sexual offenses to reflect case law.
- 4. <u>Uninsured Motorist</u> Consideration of a final report addressing whether the heirs of an uninsured motorist, killed in a motor vehicle accident, have a claim under the Wrongful Death Act and the Survivorship Act.
- 5. <u>Special Civil- Attorney's fees</u> Consideration of a tentative report concerning mandatory attorney's fees in Special Civil actions.
- 6. <u>Collateral Consequences</u> An update on Staff's efforts to compile all collateral consequences of criminal convictions imposed by state law and its attempts to evaluate whether current statutory schemes allow sufficient opportunities for relief upon a convict's rehabilitation.
- 7. <u>Mortgage Recording</u> Further consideration of a Memorandum and a Draft Tentative report on the recording of mortgage assignments.
