COMMISSION MEETING AGENDA

1. Pejorative Terms Regarding Persons with Physical or Sensory Disabilities – Consideration of a Draft Tentative Report recommending elimination of pejorative language when referring to persons with physical or sensory disabilities (report supplied in April).
2. Mortgage Recording – Consideration of a Draft Tentative Report proposing a new, more limited solution to the problem experienced during foreclosures – the difficulty in proving that the plaintiff is the proper party to foreclose. Also provided for consideration is a Memorandum explaining the basis for the most recent change to the Report and raising the issue of fraud by persons claiming to be servicers of a mortgage.
3. Underground Facilities Protection Act - Consideration of a Draft Tentative Report modifying *N.J.S. 48:2-80* subsection d. to reflect the determination of the New Jersey Supreme Court in *Jersey Cent. Power & Light Co. v. Melcar Utility Co.*, 212 N.J. 576 (2013).
4. Multiple Extended-Term Sentences – Consideration of a Draft Tentative Report modifying *N.J.S. 2C:44-5* subsection b.(1) in response to the determination of the New Jersey Supreme Court in *State v. Hudson*, 209 N.J. 513 (2012).
5. Updates regarding current and completed projects – including the Revised Uniform Limited Liability Company Act (A4023 proposes technical corrections to the law) and the potential impact of *State v. Rangel* – on the Title 2C – Sexual Offenses project recently released as a Revised Tentative Report.
